MINUTES

At 4:04 p.m., the Chair (Representative Maddock), called the meeting to order and instructed the clerk to call the roll.

Under Rule 3.0 of the Standing Committee Rules of the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules, there was a quorum for routine committee business since a majority of the committee was present, but there was not a voting quorum for official committee action since a concurrent majority was not present.

Testimony was taken from Joseph Kimble, Distinguished Professor Emeritus, Western Michigan University – Cooley Law School, regarding the Plain English Standard for Administrative Rulemaking.

Regarding JCAR No. 19-15, Representative Bolden requested clarification regarding where similar language to rescinded Rule 27 can be located in the public health code.
