Construction Safety and Health Part 10 Cranes and Derricks gives direction to employers and employees on protecting Michigan employees from health and safety hazards in the workplace when using cranes and derricks.

These rules are being amended due to the following recently revised federal regulations, in order to be at least as effective as the federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) standards.

- 1926.1427 Operator training, certification, and evaluation.
- 1926.1430 Training.

In addition, minor editorial and formatting changes are being made.
