NOTE: Implementation of this policy is contingent upon State Plan Amendment approval from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).

This bulletin is issued in response to the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) Fiscal Year (FY) 2020 budget appropriations of Public Act 154 of 2019. From state-appropriated funds, Section 459 of the Act directs MDHHS to increase Medicaid reimbursement rates for physician neonatal and pediatric critical care and intensive care services.

Effective for dates of service on and after February 1, 2020, practitioner rates associated with the following inpatient neonatal and pediatric critical and intensive care Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) codes will be reimbursed at 95% of the Medicare annual rate. All Medicaid practitioner rates are reviewed and updated annually and published at www.michigan.gov/medicaidproviders >> Billing & Reimbursement >> Provider Specific Information >> Physicians/Practitioners/Medical Clinics.
