Rules Primer

The Pharmacy – Animal Euthanasia and Sedation Rules regulate the permitting, training, purchasing, storing, possession, handling, and administering of drugs by animal control shelters, animal protection shelters, and Class B dealers to perform sedation and euthanasia on animals. The rules are intended to ensure that animals are not treated inhumanely when they are tranquilized or euthanized.

Summary of the Final Proposed Rule

The proposed rule revisions will:

- Ensure that managers and employees of animal control shelters, animal protection shelters, or Class B dealers who acquire, store, and administer tranquilizing or euthanizing drugs receive additional training in the humane use of tranquilizers and euthanizing drugs.
- Require better record keeping of controlled substances.
- Increase the use of sedation in euthanasia of animals.

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- Reduce the number of animals injuring themselves or people attempting to immobilize an animal by ensuring shelters are sedating and immobilizing animals with appropriate training and drugs.
- Provide for more humane, less painful, treatment of animals.

Stakeholder Engagement

Development of the proposed rules occurred in consultation with, and approval of, the Michigan Board of Pharmacy (Board). Public Engagement and Public Hearing/Comment/Information

The public comment period began on June 16, 2021 and ended on July 2, 2021. The notice of public comment period, in addition to being posted in various newspapers as required, was posted on the LARA website, and distributed via email listserv to all interested parties. The public hearing was held virtually at 9:00 a.m. on July 2, 2021.

There were no comments received in opposition and two comments in support were made at the public hearing by the following individuals:

- Nancy Frank the Michigan Veterinary Medical Association
- Ann Griffin Michigan Humane Society.

Various Rules Committee Work Group Meetings were held to review and discuss the proposed rules. The Board of Pharmacy Rules Committee, BPL staff, members of the public, and representative of associations attended the meeting.

Modifications Made Due to Public Comment

No modifications were made to the proposed rules due to public comments made during the public comment period or made at the public hearing held on July 2, 2021. Suggestions offered by the public were taken into consideration and changes were incorporated into the proposed rules prior to the public hearing.

Significant Issues Not Incorporated in the Final Proposed Rules

There were no significant issues that were not incorporated into the final proposed rules.
