The purpose of this policy is to clarify that bulletin MSA 20-75, issued December 23, 2020, which established coverage of COVID-19 vaccine services does not apply to MI Health Link.

MI HEALTH LINK COVERAGE OF COVID-19 VACCINE SERVICES

Integrated Care Organizations (ICOs) must ensure enrollees have full freedom of choice of COVID-19 vaccine providers, both in-network and out-of-network. During calendar years 2020 and 2021, the cost of the vaccine administration will be covered by the Medicare Fee-for-Service (FFS) program for all MI Health Link beneficiaries. ICOs and providers serving MI Health Link beneficiaries should refer to the Center's for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) COVID-19 guidance found at COVID-19 | CMS as well as the Health Plan Management System (HPMS) memo titled COVID-19 Vaccine Significant Cost Determination dated October 28, 2020, found at HPMS Memos for WK 4 October 26-30, 2020 | CMS.
