COVID-19 Vaccine Services for CSHCS Beneficiaries

This policy notifies Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) Medicaid enrolled providers of important information regarding CSHCS coverage of COVID-19 vaccine services as an addition to Bulletin MSA 20-75, COVID-19 Response: Coverage of COVID-19 Vaccine Services. Effective for dates of service on or after December 1, 2020, CSHCS will provide coverage and reimbursement for COVID-19 vaccine services for all beneficiaries who are otherwise uninsured. This is a permanent policy change and does not expire following the termination of the federally declared COVID-19 Public Health Emergency (PHE) conditions.

Detailed information regarding coverage and reimbursement for COVID-19 vaccine administration can be found in Bulletin MSA 20-75, which can be accessed on the MDHHS website at www.michigan.gov/medicaidproviders >> Policy, Letters and Forms. The influenza vaccine will be covered and reimbursed consistent with existing Medicaid policies.

COVID-19 EUA Drugs, Devices, and Biological Products for CSHCS Beneficiaries

Also effective for dates of service on or after December 1, 2020, for the duration of the federally declared COVID-19 PHE, CSHCS will cover FDA EUA drugs, devices, and biological products for COVID-19 prevention and treatment for all CSHCS beneficiaries who are otherwise uninsured. This information is in addition to Bulletin MSA-20-81, COVID-19 Response: Coverage of U.S. Food & Drug Administration (FDA) Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) Drugs, Devices and Biological Products for COVID-19 Prevention and Treatment.
