The purpose of this bulletin is to clarify licensing requirements for IHS facilities, which include tribal health centers and tribal federally qualified health centers operating SUD programs.

Effective January 1, 2021, governmental entities operating outpatient SUD programs are not required to be licensed by the State of Michigan. IHS facilities are subject to the standards set forth in 42 CFR § 431.110 for reimbursement of Medicaid services. If state licensure is not available to or required of an IHS facility, state licensure of that SUD program is not required for reimbursement of those Medicaid-covered services.
