NOTE: Implementation of this policy is contingent upon approval of a State Plan Amendment (SPA) by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).

Pursuant to the requirements of Section 2703 of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act/Section 1945 of the Social Security Act, the purpose of this policy is to provide for the coverage and reimbursement of Opioid Health Home (OHH) services in additional Michigan counties effective for dates of service on and after October 1, 2022. The policy applies to fee-for-service and managed care beneficiaries enrolled in Medicaid, the Healthy Michigan Plan, or MIChild who meet OHH eligibility criteria. In addition, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) has created a companion operation guide for providers called the <u>OHH Handbook</u>.

General Information

MDHHS is seeking approval from CMS to revise the current OHH SPA to optimize and expand the OHH in select Michigan counties. The OHH will provide comprehensive care management and coordination services to Medicaid beneficiaries with an opioid use disorder. (Refer to the Opioid Health Homes section of the Behavioral and Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities Supports and Services chapter within the <u>MDHHS Medicaid Provider Manual</u> for a detailed description of the OHH structure.)

Geographic Criteria

OHH services will be added to PIHP Regions 5, 8 and counties Barry, Berrien, Branch, Cass, St. Joseph, and Van Buren in Region 4.
