Section 1002 ("Health Insurance for Former Foster Youth") of the Substance Use-Disorder Prevention That Promotes Opioid Recovery and Treatment for Patients and Communities (SUPPORT) Act, signed into law on October 24, 2018, amends Medicaid coverage requirements for the Former Foster Youth (FFY) eligibility category that provides youth who aged out of foster care with Medicaid eligibility up to age 26. As a result of the change, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) will now cover FFY who received Medicaid at the time they aged out of foster care, regardless of the state the FFY lived in at the time they aged out.
