At 3:33 p.m., Chair (Representative Maddock), called the meeting to order and instructed the clerk to call the roll.

Representative Wozniak moved that the minutes from the September 11, 2019, meeting be approved. There being no objections, the minutes were adopted.

At 3:34 p.m. Senator Irwin entered the committee meeting.

Senator Lucido moved to excuse absent members. There being no objections, absent members were excused.

The Chair reviewed from September 11, 2019 meeting when Professor Kimball from Cooley Law School testified on plain English standards. He requested the committee counsel to share a memorandum on that topic that was previously prepared for the Chair with the members and suggested that LSB meet with Professor Kimball again to review our forms and templates.

At approximately 3:37 p.m., Representatives Bolden and Garrett entered the committee

meeting.

The following proposed rule set was taken up for consideration by the committee:

**JCAR 19-18 Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs, Board of Pharmacy, Pharmacy – Controlled Substances (MOAHR No. 2019-057 LR)**

Senator McBroom asked the committee counsel what the options are for the committee regarding these rules. Discussion followed.

Senator Lucido requested that the committee, go at ease.

After reconvening and discussion, the department stated that the rules were withdrawn with permission from the Chair and Alternate Chair, and that the department will work with the committee members on the language of this rule.

The Chairman confirmed with the committee counsel that the letter would be prepared the next day.

The following proposed rule set was taken up for consideration by the committee:

**JCAR No. 19-19 Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE), Air Quality Division, Part 4. Emission Limitations and Prohibitions – Sulfur-Bearing Compounds (MOAHR No. 2017-062 EG)**

There were no comments or testimony from the public. There were no representatives from the department present to testify.

The Chair asked if there were any comments from the members of the committee. There were none.

**JCAR No. 19-20, Department of Health and Human Services, Policy and Innovation Division, Nonopioid Directive (MOAHR No. 2019-045)**

Representative Garrett asked if the opioid directive can be removed once the person had put it in place. The committee counsel said that yes, that it could be removed.
