# Proposed Policy Draft

Note: Implementation of this policy is contingent upon approval of a State Plan Amendment (SPA) by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).

The purpose of this policy is to provide for the coverage and reimbursement of Substance Use Disorder Health Home (SUD-HH) services effective for dates of service on and after October 1, 2024. The policy applies to fee-for-service and managed care beneficiaries enrolled in Medicaid, the Healthy Michigan Plan, or MIChild who meet health home eligibility criteria. In addition, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) will create a companion operation's guide for providers, the Substance Use Disorder Health Home Handbook, which will be housed on the Opioid Health Home (michigan.gov) website.

#### **General Information**

MDHHS is seeking approval from CMS to revise the current Opioid Health Home (OHH) SPA to optimize and expand services statewide and expand eligibility. The OHH will provide comprehensive care management and coordination services to eligible Medicaid beneficiaries with a diagnosis of opioid use disorder, alcohol use disorder and/or stimulant use disorder.

#### Geographic Criteria

The current OHH will expand to a Substance Use Disorder Health Home (SUD-HH) and will add PIHP Region 3 (Allegan, Kent, Lake, Mason, Muskegon, Oceana, Ottawa counties).

### **Diagnostic Criteria**

Medicaid beneficiaries with International Classification of Diseases (ICD-10) codes for opioid use disorder, alcohol use disorder and/or stimulant use disorder.
