## BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY OF PROPOSED RULES

Rule Set 2018-074 HS would establish 4 new rules for the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) to require reporting by health professionals and health facilities of prescription or illicit drug poisonings. DHHS would be required to develop procedures and systems to enable electronic reporting, and would be responsible for security of reported and retained information, as well analysis. The Public Health Code authorizes DHHS to require reporting for surveillance of public health data to enable effective state and local public health activities and response. DHHS wants to expand tracking and data of drug poisonings in Michigan to this purpose.

## FISCAL IMPACT OF PROPOSED RULES

Additional reporting, retention, and analysis of public health data will require increased expenditures by DHHS. The Department has indicated that grant funds from the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention are being used to implement the new rules, which include building a surveillance module for the new reporting with the use of an existing communicable disease data reporting system. No additional funding is required.

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
