FISCAL IMPACT: The rules would not have a significant fiscal impact on the State, and would cost fire departments operated by local units of government the following average estimated amounts as detailed in Table 1:

Table 1

Fire Department Size	Average Reported Estimated Cost
Small	\$302,700
Medium	\$961,600
Large	\$258,300
Very Large	\$1,560,200

These figures were obtained from a survey sent out by MIOSHA to a number of fire departments of varying sizes, asking what their anticipated cost would be to comply with these rules changes. The survey defined a 'small' fire department as one with an annual budget of \$10,000 to \$500,000, 'medium' as \$500,001 to \$3,000,000, 'large' as \$3,000,001 to \$8,000,000, and 'very large' as \$8,000,001 or greater. It should be noted that the number of respondents in certain categories was very low, and may result in estimates that are skewed for that category.
