**Cosmetology – General Rules (MOAHR 2019-028 LR)**  
**Authority:** MCL 339.205, MCL 339.1203, and MCL 339.1205 and Executive Reorganization Order Nos. 1991-9, 1996-2, 2003-1, and 2011-4, MCL 338.3501, MCL 445.2001, MCL 445.2011, MCL 445.2030.  
**Overview:** The proposed rules will revise the definitions of terms used in the rules, identify the examinations required for licensure, set forth requirements for licensure by reciprocity and relicensure, sunset the current provisions for branch facility licensure, update the minimum operational standards for a school of cosmetology and cosmetology establishments, revise the cosmetology curriculum requirements, and revise health and safety requirements.

Nolan was assigned to St. Stephen about three years ago, about the same time as Smolenski was married to her partner of 27 years. Her marriage was a public news story, and Smolenski said Nolan was aware of her orientation for some time.

During the conversation with Nolan, Smolenski said she was told her marriage was the crux of the issue.

Smolenski said she doesn't understand the stance from Nolan or the Diocese of Grand Rapids, which issued a statement Wednesday that supported Nolan. The Diocese statement reads, in part:

"Inclusion and acceptance have been a hallmark of Catholic Churches in the Diocese of Grand Rapids throughout the diocese's history. They remain so. They presume, however, a respect on the part of individuals for the teachings and practice of the wider Catholic community. ...

"Father Nolan approached Judge Smolenski privately. Subsequent media reports do not change the appropriateness of his action, which the diocese supports."

For Smolenski's part, she said she does not want controversy at her church and did not seek any publicity on the Communion issue.

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he is thrown out of office, he shouldn't go alone.

John Mandelaris said in an email to The Flint Journal that his term as chairman of the commission ends Dec. 31, and he hasn't taken any actions on his own.

"The five-member board acts as a unit and no individual member can set policy under 1951 Public Act 51," Mandelaris wrote in the email. "Therefore, if the ... members of the County Board (of Commissioners) who voted to commence removal proceedings because they are unhappy with the ongoing road commission activities ... should target the entire five-member Board of Road Commissioners for removal."

County commissioners voted 7-2 in November for its attorneys to take the steps necessary to remove Mandelaris and Vice Chairman Robert Johnson from office after some commissioners said they have lost faith in the pair's leadership.

Mandelaris' email says anyone who wants new leadership of the commission only has to wait a month and it will happen on its own — after his and Johnson's terms as chairman and vice chairman expire.

Johnson declined to comment on the potential hearing to remove him from office when reached by The Journal on Tuesday.

County commissioners Brenda Clack and Bryant Nolden, both Flint Democrats, have voted against moving forward with the attempted removals.

County commissioners appoint the five members of the road commission, which oversees the construction and maintenance of county roads and bridges and the administration of funds from gas and weight taxes.


