She plays clarinets, the coronavirus pandemic is economically much worse than the world for clarinet concerts, she's playing in the French Quarter (drums). After Katrina, she could travel for gigs. Her once-full calendar has dwindled to nothing.

Theater reads, "Everything you love about New Orleans is because of Black people" — a testament to the food, music, and parades that African Americans have created in the city.

But for the Black people who make up the tourism industry's backbone — hotel cleaners, Frenchman Street musicians, line cooks — the work usually hasn't meant wealth.

"This is still the best tourist

destination in the world," said Jay H. Banks, a Black City Council member. "People want to come here because of this magic. But it certainly has not been of great benefit to the people that make the magic happen."

Black and Hispanic workers fill a disproportionate share of hotel-industry jobs paying less than \$15 hourly, while the relatively small number paying more are largely filled by white

staffers, a 2018 Data Center report found.

That's amid soaring housing costs. Rents increased 50% from pre-Katrina amounts, a 2015 Housing NOLA report said. Black residents have more trouble making rent, with over 60% using at least a third of income on housing.

Renter Shaun Mills sees how the housing landscape has changed since Katrina — the double shotguns converted to single-family homes, rebuilt public housing with fewer units, pricey condos springing up.

Even before he lost his line-cook job at Harrah's sports bar amid the pandemic, he said, he struggled.

"The prices of your rent, the prices of the insurance, the living expenses, the food expenses. Everything goes up year after year except for the pay," he said. "How can you expect a grown person to be able to provide for his family?"

After Katrina, billions of recovery dollars flowed into the city, largely rebuilding structural damage. Yet Black New Orleans families are hurting, advocates say. Black households earn significantly less. About half the city's Black children live in poverty, compared with 9% of white children, The Data Center says. Analysts do point to some gains — the 2016 Medicaid expansion improved health care access, and the jail population has dropped.

Mary and Barrett Duplessis have found firmer footing since Katrina but still lived month-to-month pre-pandemic.

The Michigan Gaming Control Board will hold a public hearing at the following time and date to receive comments by interested persons on Internet sports betting and Internet gaming rules.

Date: September 23, 2020

Time: 1:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m.

In accordance with Executive Order 2020-154 and to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 by practicing social-distancing measures, **the public hearing will be held virtually via Microsoft Teams in order to receive public comments.** In accordance with Governor Whitmer and the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services' recommendations designed to help prevent the spread of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19), the virtual public hearing will occur in lieu of the in-person hearing.

The rules establish a framework for secure, responsible, fair, and legal system of internet gaming and internet sports betting. The Lawful Internet Gaming Act, MCL 432.301 to 432.322, and the Lawful Sports Betting Act, MCL 432.401 to 432.419, were enacted on December 20, 2019, authorizing the operation, conduct, and offering of internet gaming and internet sports betting which were already occurring in this state illegally. It was found to be in the best interest of this state and its citizens to regulate this activity by establishing a secure, responsible, fair, and legal system of internet gaming and internet sports betting. The systems are designed to protect participants and capture revenue in the form of taxes and payments.

The proposed rules provide protections for the public in the following ways: (a) setting forth responsible gaming measures; (b) providing for integrity monitoring; (c) providing the Board with oversight capabilities; (d) providing protections for authorized participants when setting up an account or placing an internet wager; (e) setting qualifications, standards, and procedures for approval and licensure of operators, suppliers, and occupational licensees; (f) setting technical and security standards; and (g) setting internal control standards for operators and platform providers. These measures are designed to protect the public interest in secure, responsible, fair, and legal system of internet gaming and internet sport betting while at the same time promoting a regulatory environment that is the least burdensome alternative for those required to comply.

In addition to the public hearing, interested parties may submit written comments to Michigan Gaming Control Board, PO Box 30786, Lansing, Michigan 48909, Attention: Wendy Harns, no later than 5:00 p.m. on September 23, 2020. Written comments may also be sent electronically to MGCB-Rules@michigan.gov.

The rules are published on the Michigan Government website at <http://www.michigan.gov/moahr> and will appear in the September 15, 2020, issue of the Michigan Register. Copies of the draft rules may also be obtained by mail or electronic request at the address above.

These rules are promulgated by authority conferred on the Michigan Gaming Control Board under $\frac{3}{4}$ 10 of the Lawful Internet Gaming Act, MCL 432.310, and $\frac{3}{4}$ 10(1) of the Lawful Sports Betting Act, MCL 432.410(1). These rules become effective immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.



In accordance with Executive Order 2020-154 and to mitigate the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Michigan Gaming Control Board is implementing social-distancing measures, **the public hearing will be held via a virtual meeting. Teams in order to receive public comments.** In accordance with the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services' recommendations to prevent the spread of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19), the public hearing will be held in lieu of the in-person hearing.

The rules establish a framework for secure, responsible, fair gaming and internet sports betting. The Lawful Internet Gaming Act, MCL 432.310 to 432.319, and the Lawful Sports Betting Act, MCL 432.401 to 432.419, were promulgated in 2019, authorizing the operation, conduct, and offering of internet sports betting which were already occurring in this state illegally. The Michigan Gaming Control Board is authorized to regulate this activity by promulgating rules that are secure, responsible, fair, and legal system of internet gaming and internet sports betting designed to protect participants and capture revenue in the state.

The proposed rules provide protections for the public in the form of: (a) providing for integrity monitoring and oversight capabilities; (b) providing for integrity monitoring and oversight capabilities; (c) setting up an account or placing an internet wager; (d) setting up an account or placing an internet wager; (e) setting up an account or placing an internet wager; (f) setting up an account or placing an internet wager; (g) setting up an account or placing an internet wager.
