

## How O.J. Simpson burned the Ford Bronco into America's collective memory

The Ford Bronco initially was conceived and designed for rugged outdoorsy types, a two-door means of escape to nature from the bustling cities of mid-century Amer-

But it had already been tamed and polished for suburbanites, with cruise control and air conditioning, by 1994, when O.J. Simpson cowered in the back of one, a handgun to his temple, as patrol cars followed it for about two hours in the California twilight.

The model was discontinued two years later. But the Bronco – or at least that white Bronco - became one of America's most iconic automobiles after the slow-speed chase that played out on TV screens before an audience of millions, a moment that was seared indelibly into the nation's cultural memory.

"Kids who were born in the 2000s, even they know that's O.J.," Marcus Collins, a University of Michigan marketing professor, said of his students. "It's just as salient as me showing the twin towers on fire. It definitely became etched in the zeitgeist because of all the contextual associations that

we applied to it." The Bronco ridden in by Simpson, who died Wednesday, now sits in a crime museum in Tennessee, parked near a Volkswagen Beetle that was driven by serial killer Ted Bundy.

White Ford Bronco is also the name of a band that plays 1990s cover songs, by artists from Metallica to Will Smith to the Spice Girls.

Singer and guitarist Diego Valencia, 41, said he was brainstorming band names in 2008 when a co-worker suggested it.

"With something like 'Seinfeld' or 'Beverly Hills 90210,' you might be losing some people," Valencia said. "But that was the most '90s thing ever."

The White Ford Bronco name is not a celebration of Simpson, Valencia said, but a nod to that moment of "where were you in June of

MARKETED TO HUNT-ERS AND FISHERMEN

The Bronco rolled off the assembly line in 1966 as one of the first sport-utility vehicles, said Todd Zuercher, an auto historian and author of the 2019 book "Ford Bronco: A History of Ford's Legendary 4x4."

"The whole thing back then was get out and get away from the hustle and bustle of urban life and get into the backcountry," Zuercher said.

The vehicle was marketed to hunters and fishermen but also to families for exploring, Zuercher said. The Bronco was an improvement over competing models, such as the Jeep CJ-5 and the International Scout, because it had a hard top, a heater and maybe even a radio.

SUVs progressively became larger and more luxurious over the years, Zuercher said, and by time of the Simpson car chase, the Bronco was on its fifth generation.

Simpson also owned a Bronco, but it was seized as evidence after blood was found inside. The one involved in the police pursuit was a 1993 XLT model belonging to his friend, former teammate and the driver that evening, Al "A.C." Cowl-

'HE WAS

CHECKING OUT' Simpson was charged with murder after his ex-wife, Nicole Brown Simpson, and her friend Ronald Goldman were found stabbed to death. Simpson failed to surrender to police as promised and was declared a fugitive on June 17, 1994.

He was spotted later in the Bronco with Cowlings, sparking a 60-mile (96-kilometer) police pursuit across Southern California. More

than 90 million Americans thunderstruck, watched, as TV helicopters provided live shots of the action. Thousands more lined freeways and city streets, some cheering the former star running back as the bizarre

motorcade passed by. Cowlings said there was only one thing on his mind: keeping Simpson alive.

"He was checking out," Cowlings told The Associated Press in 1996. "There's no way O.J. and I were trying to escape. I was trying to save a friend.'

Clutching a family photo, Simpson was ultimately coaxed out of the Bronco and gave himself up in the driveway of his Brentwood home. Police found a gun, Simpson's passport, a fake beard and thousands of dollars in cash and checks in the vehicle.

The make of the vehicle seemed to heighten the dra-

"If it were a Jeep Wrangler, it almost could have been any of us," said Collins, the marketing professor. "But because it was a white Ford Bronco, it stood out. It was a distinctive vehicle with this very distinctive person, O.J. It was still on brand.'

SOCCER MOMS WEREN'T DRIVING **BRONCOS** 

There has been speculation that the chase hastened the Bronco's demise, or alternatively that it led to an uptick in sales.

Zuercher, the auto historian, said the Bronco was already on its last legs at the time. As a two-door SUV, it couldn't compete with fourdoor models that were family-friendly and extremely popular. The Ford Explorer, for example, was a runaway hit when it came out in 1990.

"Most of the soccer moms of the 1990s weren't driving Ford Broncos," Zuercher said. "There were two more model years after the O.J. chase, and then the Bronco was gone for 25 years."

# Argentina's populist president meets billionaire Elon Musk in Texas — and a bromance is born

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina - One is an erratic billionaire entrepreneur and self-declared freespeech absolutist, prone to profanity-laden rants against "wokeness" and obsessed with making humanity a multi-planetary species.

The other is an iconoclastic Latin American leader and self-declared anarcho-capitalist, prone to cloning his dead dogs and obsessed with destroying state controls.

Tech executive Elon Musk and Argentine President Javier Milei finally sealed their budding bro-mance Friday at a Tesla electric car factory in Tex- their first meeting after months of mutual admiration on social media.

It was a match made in free-market heaven.

In social media posts that thrilled their right-wing fans, the pair played up their real-life friendship.

"To an exciting & inspiring future!" Musk wrote on X, or Twitter as it was known before he bought it in 2022, along with a photo of him and Milei both grinning widely and giving the camera two thumbs up, the libertarian president's trademark gesture.

live freedom, "Long dammit!" Milei wrote in his own X post, which included a selfie of the pair, with the president sporting his signature leather bomber and Musk in his Air Force Academy navy sports jacket.

The meeting was closed to the press and a statement

from Milei's office produced little news, saying the free-market enthusiasts discussed issues, ranging from the expected (how to promote entrepreneurship by slashing red-tape) to the random (the existential danger posed by declining birth rates).

Milei's office said that the president offered to help Musk in the clash between social media company X and Brazilian authorities, which have accused Musk of obstruction for defying a judge's order to block some accounts.

The two also agreed to host "a big event soon in Argentina to promote the ideas of freedom," the Argentine presidency said, but provided no further details.

But behind the smiley photo-op — and video of Milei's joy ride in a futuristic Cybertruck pickup much was at stake for Argentina.

Support from the U.S. – particularly at the International Monetary Fund, to which Argentina owes over \$42 billion is critical to boosting investor confidence in the South American country, as Milei seeks to overhaul a broken with economy ket-oriented policies.

With the revival of socialist governments across Latin America, from Chile to Brazil, experts say Argentina is now poised to emerge as a key strategic partner for Washington.

"There's a chance that Argentina can fill this vacuum and eventually be a strategic partner for the

U.S.," said Sergio Berensztein, who runs a political consultancy in Buenos Aires. "Musk can serve to speed this process of Argentina becoming part of the (U.S.) new network of friends.

Last month, Musk's company delivered Starlink satellite internet service to Argentina, a move cheered by farmers struggling to keep up with hightech agriculture in remote parts of the country.

Gerardo Werthein, Argentina's ambassador to the U.S., attended Friday's meeting and told La Naci□n newspaper that Milei and Musk discussed Argentina's vast reserves of strategic minerals, including lithium, an indispensable ingredient in batteries for electric cars.

"He expressed wanting to help Argentina, and had a very good view of everything we have, mainly lithium," Werthein said of Musk.

Milei's love for free markets and close alignment with U.S. policy a major shift after years of left-wing governments that adopted interventionist policies and strained relations with Washington - has raised hopes in the U.S. that lithium and other badly needed metals can be extracted closer to home, breaking China's dominance of the battery supply chain.

Analysts say that a successful energy transition in the U.S. will demand far more lithium and other essential commodities than the country is now on track to produce.
