## **BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY OF PROPOSED RULES**

The proposed rules amend 6 existing administrative rules related to the requirement for blood lead analysis reporting by clinical laboratories to the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services. The changes include receipt of laboratory results of lead samples with decimal points rather than rounding to integers, and to specify how laboratories should report results less than the limit of detection.

## **FISCAL IMPACT OF PROPOSED RULES**

### State

There is no direct fiscal impact to the Department of Health and Human Services from the proposed rule changes. The recording of data with decimal points is current practice using the Department's current data management system.

### Local

The proposed rule changes have no direct fiscal impact on local units of government.
