BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY OF PROPOSED RULES

Rule Set 2020-128 LR would make numerous amendments and additions to rules pertaining to pharmacy professions and facilities. Significant changes accomplished via the rule set include the following: numerous changes to educational, licensure, and relicensure requirements; establishing requirements for remote pharmacy licenses; updating onsite physical inspection requirements for pharmacies engaging in sterile compounding; expanding records retention requirements; providing requirements for electronic prescription transmission and providing the process for electronic transmission waivers.

FISCAL IMPACT OF PROPOSED RULES

2020-128 LR is not anticipated to have a significant fiscal impact on the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs or on any other state or local government units. LARA may experience modest administrative costs due to the rule set, but such costs would likely be sufficiently offset by licensure fees.

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
